Welcome to Barcelona



Barcelona is located on the coast and bounded by the Collserola ridge and rivers Besos and Llobregat. The city is less than 150 kilometres from the Pyrenees. Barcelona's location on the shores of the Mediterranean means that it enjoys a warm, welcoming climate and pleasant temperatures all year round. Rainfall is occasionally heavy, with levels of around 1.000mm per year. This helps to maintain the many green areas around the city.



Barcelona is the city of marvels. The old town, comprising the Gothic Quarter, the Ribera and Raval districts, and famed for its historical monuments, narrow streets and bohemian atmosphere, is a perfect place for a stroll. A wander through the maze of streets is essential in order to understand the different periods in the history of Barcelona and to admire its finest monuments: traces of the Roman wall glimpsed between well-preserved Gothic buildings, the remains of the Jewish Quarter, witnesses to the industrial expansion of the 19th century and the design of the 20th. Musicians in the medieval streets provide the ideal accompaniment. The city also has the biggest selection of modernist architecture: a genuine open-air museum. Most of the buildings, built in this unique style, are in the Eixample, a district planned in 1860 by the engineer Ildefons Cerdà which constitutes a unique model of European urban planning. The Sagrada Família, the Casa Batlló, the Casa Amatller and the Casa Milà are some examples of this.



Barcelona is the only European capital with over four kilometres of beaches where you can enjoy the most modern amenities, the beaches are not far form Barcelona's historical and cultural landmarks, and they have opened up our modern and cosmopolitan city to the sea. Today, the Olympic Harbour and the old port, the Port Vell, are some of the main meeting places, with many bars, restaurants, shops and recreational areas. Barcelona is, without a doubt, a city of marvels: on foot, by bicycle or bus, it is a magnificent spectacle which you should not miss.



Barcelona is known throughout the world as a cultural city, with an important heritage and a permanent and exciting range of activities on offer. It is a city of renowned architectural interest, from its Roman walls to the new urban planning schemes of the eighties. Particular highlights are its modernist heritage and contemporary architecture. Over 40 museums: monographic art collections such as the Museu Picasso, the Fundació Joan Miró and the Fundació Antoni Tàpies which hold permanent exhibitions of works by the artists as well as temporary shows; the world's finest collection of Romanesque art at the Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya; temporary exhibitions of contemporary art at the Museu d'Art Contemporani de Barcelona - MACBA; and numerous art galleries.



Barcelona is famed for the wide variety of its musical events. From classical music, opera and ballet, through jazz, flamenco, pop and rock, to the most innovative festivals. In 1999 the city regained its opera house, the Gran Teatre del Liceu, and opened the Auditori with a programme featuring the most diverse genres and musical styles. In addition to these musical events we find those of the Palau de la Música Catalana, a jewel of modernist architecture.







Abstract submission







All delegates wishing to present a paper must do send their abstracts through the Congress web site. This means that traditional ways of sending in abstracts (i.e. e-mail, fax, mail) have been ruled out.

This page illustrates some of the header pages on the Congress web site. The web site structure is similar to that of other congresses (presentation, scientific programme, general information, committees, etc) but for the first time includes the possibility of sending paper abstracts online. In order to send your abstract, you must click on the "Abstract Submission" tab. However, please note that to do so you must be a registered user. Once you have registered your name and chosen your password, you can access the "Abstract Submission" section, where you will be required to fill out the full details of the main author and any co-authors (up to a maximum of 3).

Abstracts will be limited to 250 words maximum, with a minimum of 200 words, with a tab where any symbols can be inserted. Only text will be allowed – neither figures nor tables can be included.



EBOMFS-Announcement

INTRODUCTION: The European Board of Oro-Maxillo-Facial Surgery (EBOMFS) in common with other European Boards of recognized UEMS-Specialties is conducting RQ (Recognition of Qualification) - Assessments. The European Board exists to enhance the standards of training and practice through different means. Among those is the EBOMFS - Assessment, which will give the title of "Fellow of the EBOMFS". The Assessment is voluntary and does not affect free movement of doctors in Europe.

ELIGIBILITY: Candidates for the R.Q.-Assessment must satisfy one of the three following terms.

- Recognized specialists in oral and maxillofacial surgery in one of the countries of the E.U. where the specialty is based on a medical and dental degree.
- Recognized specialists in oral and maxillofacial surgery in one of the countries of the E.U. where the specialty is based on a medical degree.
- Recognized specialists in oral and maxillofacial surgery in one of the countries of the E.U. where the specialty is based on a dental degree, provided this specialist also holds a medical degree.

The candidate for the R.Q.-Assessment shall have been a recognized specialist in oral and maxillofacial surgery for at least 3 years. It shall be demonstrated that he or she has effectively practised oral and maxillofacial surgery during this period. It shall be proved that he or she has shown continuing scientific and / or continuing medical training interest in the specialty.

STRUCTURE: The assessment will be in two parts.

- 1.0. Curriculum vitae and logbook in English.
- 2.1. Multiple Choice Exam (MCQ) in simple English.
- 2.2. Oral Examination (interview) of the candidate.

The Oral Examination will be carried out using one out of the following four languages: English, French, German, Spanish. Exceptionally, if the candidate cannot cope with any of these four languages and do not agree with the offered suggestion should contact the Secretary General for further proposals in order to find appropriate examiners for Oral Assessment. The oral interview will last one hour and consists of two parts:

A. Questions covering the whole scope of the specialty.

B. Case report. Each candidate must be ready to present three well documented personal cases: (using slides, photographs, medical imaging, casts, histology, laboratory findings etc...). Candidates who do not pass the MCQ will not be permitted to enter the Oral Examination. The Oral Examination of the assessment will be conducted by a panel of three assessors selected by the board. The chairman of each jury will be from the same country as the candidate. The decision of the assessors will be final.

The fee for the assessment will be $400 \, \text{m}$ payable with the application for the assessment. A copy of the bank draft or a cheque must be enclosed. The fee cannot be refunded. The deadline for Application for the 2006 Assessment will be the 15th of March 2006. The assessment will take place just before the XVIII EACMFS Congress in Barcelona, Spain, from Sept. 10th to Sept. 11th, 2006. Specialists wishing to take an Assessment or wishing to obtain further instructions and application forms should contact the Secretary General of EBOMFS, President of the Scientific Committee of EBOMFS or the national EBOMFS representatives.
