
We aim to build a research network which will hopefully benefit each one of us.

Regarding the EACMFS Eastern Europe Educational Projects, the third course of the second Skopje's program was held in April 19-20, 2013 under the direction of Prof Vladimir Popovski. The topics included facial aesthetic surgery – implant and preimplant surgery. More than 70 participants attended the course coming mainly from Macedonia but also from Serbia, Bulgaria, Albania and Kosovo.

We also scientifically supported an International Conference on Orthognathic Surgery which was held in Saint Petersburg, Russia and the 13th Congress of the Serbian Association of Maxillofacial Surgeons and 2nd Conference of the Balkan Association held in Nis between 7-9 November 2013. The meeting in Saint Petersburg took place under the direction of Andrey Andreishchev in May 27-29, 2013. Prof Maurice Mommaerts was the official EACMFS speaker. During the Congress in Serbia an EACMFS Session was held including topics on Paediatric Maxillofacial Trauma (Dr Garcia Recuero), Craniofacial Malformations (Prof Joachim Obwegeser) and New Technologies in Planning of Maxillofacial Reconstruction (Prof Julio Acero).

The 2011 impact factor remains basically unchanged being 1.61 in 2012 and the 5-year-Journal-Impact-Factor 2012 was 1.95. Comparing our impact factor with the impact factor of the Journals dealing with craniofacial or oral-maxillofacial surgery the British Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery is the only one which is a little higher (1.950).

EACMFS Fellowships are available for our members who hold a valid license to practise medicine and are qualified specialists in maxillofacial surgery. These Fellowships aim to help those colleagues who have a special interest either in facial aesthetic/cosmetic surgery, cleft/craniofacial surgery, or head & neck oncology and are eager to achieve competency in all the aspects of the chosen subspecialty. They shall widen the individual's experience of living abroad for a year (or more) whilst working in a centre accredited by the Association. A limited financial support is offered to cover travelling costs as well as lodging for the first week in the city of the host centre for a maximum of three fellows per year per subspecialty. When applying, a complete CV, a certified log book of the operations performed during

the residency, and a list of scientific publications (co-)authored by the applicant plus written proof of all the above shall be addressed to the EACMFS Secretariat. For more details visit www.eurofaces.com
